

Happy Fall! We have been busy here at the International Office. It was good to be able to see lots of faces through Zoom that we haven't seen in a while for the Convention meetings.



Portland, OR— Patrick Lumber, headquartered here, recently announced three promotions.


Chelsea Brown was promoted to East Coast sales manager. Terry Haddix was named operations manager. And Mark Gray is now the West Coast sales manager.

FEATURED ARTICLE

As students in schools in the US and Canada are heading back to class a minute for us too to revisit the topic of forest education. Since we last spoke on this subject (Log & Tally, Summer 2020), our beloved 2x4s have made more headlines in that period versus any other. News of skyrocketing costs, shortage of homes being built, bidding wars in sought-after communities where the "work from home" masses could relocate, and the various perspectives of those writing the articles or filming the broadcasts. And the chapter again added to the story in 2021 sparking more conversation: forest fires. Are we taking enough notes over the years to remedy the challenges of the recent past?

My wife, as many of you know, is from the Czech Republic. On one trip back to the Bohemian hinterland, our son requested a tour of a castle on what happened to be his 8th birthday. The castle, Karlštejn, is a beautiful Gothic structure from the 14th century. And what greets you upon entering various halls or chambers? Wonderful wooden doors. They have been there for centuries... along with wooden wardrobes (skřiň in Czech... and a word to this day I struggle to pronounce), wooden ceiling tiles, wood panel paintings, etc. Ptolemy, a Greek geographer from the 2nd century, wrote about the forests of central Europe in this region and early human impacts even at that point (Forests of The Czech Republic, Lesny ČR 2009). Clearly people learned the usefulness of the local forests and by-products; it's easy to see examples of that from architectural details in old castles in the Czech-made wooden toys found in shops throughout Prague today. I will argue they have been taking notes --- they have a strong forest products industry and related educational component developed over the years.

Back in the USA/Canada or "down under" in Australia/New Zealand where the black cats reside, tracing history also discovers the same components are in place. A history of developing an industry that links all of us together. An industry that can provide opportunities for employment (careers if you "stick" around), community support with HHI, prospects to assist our



ever-changing climate and other "green" innovations, an abundance of materials to build homes & furniture, provide heat, cook a meal, light your way, etc.

It is important that we all take the steps in educating ourselves and people with whom we are in contact on forestry/forest products; plus retain the people and resources needed in all areas to sustain us into the future. And enjoying a hike through the forest on the weekend does not mean the resource should not be managed during the week: remember that mention of forest fires? Forest management will have to be a discussion all on its own. In the meantime, let's work together in seeing lessons are learned and share outcomes with one another.

I am sure our concatenated order could learn new ways to connect in the magnitude of media now available. Forest products education is a good way to convey our message and market our industry. Like the doors in an old castle, let's see what we are building now lasts well into the future.


J1-Roger Williams Club 51
