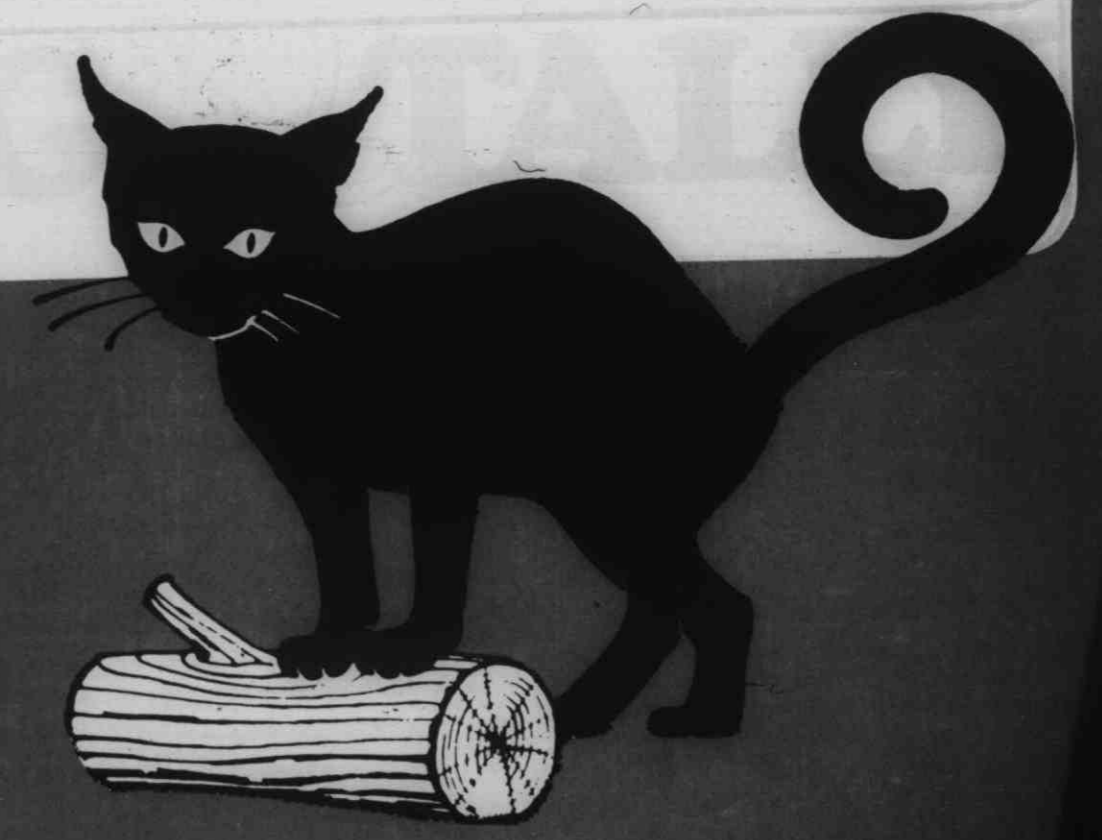

MEMO ...from the Snark's desk

A Living Past Snark.....



Editor's note: This is the 10th in a series of articles appearing in the LOG & TALLY honoring our living past Snarks.

E.F. "Ed" Wade, 55904 Rameses #55 was initiated into Hoo-Hoo April 3, 1951 at Eugene, Oregon in the Willamette Valley Hoo-Hoo Club #33. Ed served in all offices of the local club from Secretary-Treasurer on up the chairs to President. Ed served two years as Club Deputy Snark and one year as State Deputy Snark. In 1960 at the Miami Beach, Florida Convention, he was elected to the Supreme Nine.

The following year, 1961, he was re-elected to the Nine and

at the Chicago Convention in 1962, he was elevated to the high office of "Snark of the Universe". After serving his term, he was embalmed at the Vancouver, B.C. Convention in 1963 which followed one year as Chairman of the Board and finally stepping down as an international officer at the Toronto, Ontario, Convention.

During Ed's term as Snark, he had the good fortune to have nine very active and fine Hoo-Hoo members on the board. In fact, two of them later became Snark of the Universe and today one is our International Chaplain.

Ed is a native Oregonian, being born in Portland, Oregon and

has spent his entire working life in the forest products industry starting in 1935 as a green chain puller at the Pope & Talbot Lumber Company at Port Gamble, Washington. When Ed was Snark of the Universe, he was the General Sales Manager for the Snellstrom Lumber Company, a manufacturer of lumber and plywood in Eugene, Oregon, which by the way, was sold in the late 60's.

Presently, Ed is the Sales Manager for the Plywood Division of the Biles-Coleman Lumber Company at Omak, Washington, and he is still very active in Hoo-

Forest Products Week

By proclamation the President of the United States proclaims the week of October 21-27 as National Forest Products Week. This annual observance is to recognize and emphasize the importance of the forest resources to provide the raw materials for housing, for paper products and other thousands of consumer products derived from wood fibre. Multiple use management of the forests will provide these materials along with the ever expanding recreational needs.

Also each year the Shasta-Cascade Hoo Hoo Club #133, a fraternal order of lumbermen of Redding and surrounding area, joins with the Redding Trade Club as sponsors of the October meeting. At each of their meetings the Trade Club selects the Citizen of the Month. At each October meeting the Hoo Hoo Club has the privilege of selecting the Lumberman of the Year. This year that person is Carroll W. (Kelly) Galley 39873.

He was born and raised in Minnesota and attended State Teachers College at St. Cloud. He moved west in 1923 and immediately was employed by McCloud River Lumber Company at McCloud, California. Kelly followed a career in lumber from common laborer to General Sales Manager covering a span of 46 years. This included grading of lumber, shipping and then sales from 1944 to his retirement. He was named Resident Sales Manager in 1948

and in 1950 was transferred to San Francisco as Western District Sales Manager. In 1957 he was made Vice President and Sales Director covering the entire McCloud operation.

In 1963 the McCloud River Lumber Company was purchased by U.S. Plywood and he continued in the same sales capacity. In 1966 the San Francisco office was moved to Anderson and he continued to direct all lumber sales until his retirement in 1969. This same year he was honored by the Western Wood Products Association for his nearly two decades of marketing contribution to the industry. He was a director and later president of Ponderosa Pine Woodwork, a Chicago based association dedicated to the promotion of wood in windows, doors and millwork in general.

Kelly is an ardent fisherman and few, if any, have more success on Shasta Lake. He is the envy of even the best of anglers. He is an active member of River-

view Golf and Country Club and golf adds to his many diversions.

He continues to keep abreast of the lumber industry by subscribing to industry publications, by associating with lumber people and by being an active member and director of Shasta Cascade Hoo Hoo Club of Redding.

Kelly and his wife, Leona, reside at 840 Hallmark Drive in Redding. They have a married daughter living in New Jersey.

**2 New Publications
offered by FPRS**

A new 56-page publication, "MECHANICAL FASTENING OF WOOD: A REVIEW OF THE STATE OR THE ART," is now available from the Forest Products Research Society. The report covers developments in mechanical fastening since the last comprehensive review which was published in 1965. The review is authored by Dr. E. George Stern and graduate students James R. Reeves and William C. Griggs of the College of Architecture at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University,

Blacksburg, Virginia, and it covers published research in two areas: fastening with nails, staples, screws, and bolts, with more than 260 references; and fastening with plate connectors, timber connectors, and sheet-metal anchors, with more than 100 references.

G-P To Top \$2 Billion In Sales

The forest products industry and many of its customers, including housing and packaging, should benefit from the energy shortage, an industry spokesman said today in predicting 1974 gains for his company on top of new records currently being set.

R.B. Pamplin, chairman and president of Georgia-Pacific Corp., revealed that company sales will approximate \$2.2 billion for 1973 with net income more than \$160 million, both new records. Sales in 1972 were \$1.7 billion and income was \$97.6 million. Earnings per share will approximate \$3 this year compared with \$1.85.

He said both sales and earnings are expected to continue up in 1974 with pulp, paper, chemicals, redwood and hardwood lumber and such specialties as pre-finished plywood and panelboard more than offsetting the drop in softwood plywood and lumber from their record levels in early 1973.

Capital investment by G-P in 1974 for new manufacturing plants, additions and modernization will be increased, he revealed, with approximately \$275 million projected. This compares with approximately \$225 million in 1973. Projects already approved for 1974 completion include new plywood, lumber, pulp, paper and chemical capacity as well as additional internally generated energy, the preliminary year-end report reveals.

To maintain stability in the nation's economy, the housing construction industry with its low-energy requirements and high employment impact must receive special encouragement from government, Pamplin said, to help offset potential unemployment in industries related to petroleum and other energy uses.

Forest building products, with ample raw material reaching harvest age annually, plus low manufacturing energy requirements and high building insulation factors, will profit in the long run through increased demand, he predicted.

The forest industry executive pointed out that the energy shortage "can produce more benefits than problems for the nation by teaching everyone to be more efficient in both the use and production of energy."

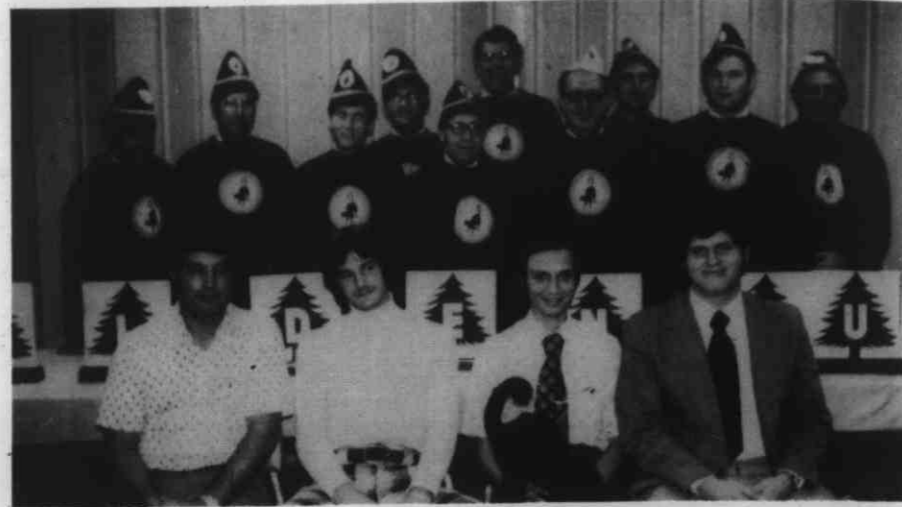

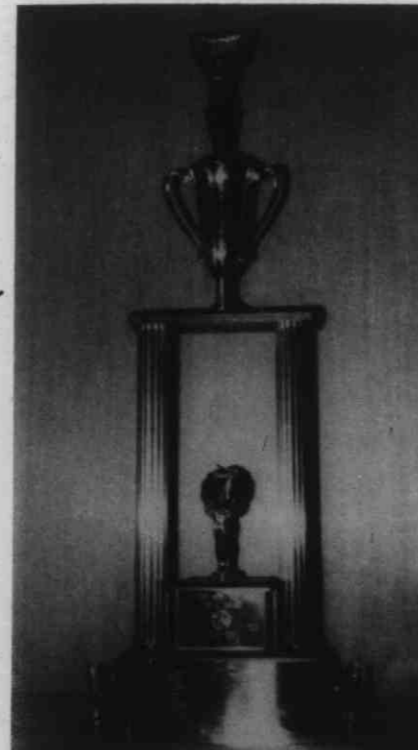

Heavy demand is forcing allocation of redwood lumber to customers nationally despite full production at its mills, Georgia-Pacific Corp. said today.

Shortages have built up in all grades with orders four to five weeks ahead of plant capacities, according to W.W. Wells, general manager of western timber and forest products.

The company's production is geared to annual growth of harvest-age timber on lands where harvesting has been under way more than a century, he said.

He noted that demand is heavy in all grades and that both industrial and home markets, and especially remodeling, are continuing strong.

The redwood timberlands in Northern California, which G-P purchased earlier this year, have been reforested since the mid 19th century with second and third growth timber reaching harvest age each year on a sustained basis.

Thousands of New Jobs If...

Thousands of new jobs could be created west of the Cascades in Washington and Oregon if intensive forestry were practiced on the Region's national forests, a Northwest forester told the House Agriculture Committee recently.

W.D. Hagenstein, Executive Vice President, Industrial Forestry Association supported leg-

islation before the Committee which would "redirect and re-motivate" the Forest Service to intensify management of the national forests. He called the current Forest Service formula for calculating allowable annual harvests from the national forests "too conservative" because it makes no allowance for capturing the mortality which occurs in both old and young trees by salvage and thinning.

Noting that present allowable harvest formulae are based on net, rather than gross growth, Hagenstein emphasized that Northwest national forests are primarily old-growth timber which adds little or no net annual growth. "With what we know about mortality we should be calculating allowable harvests on gross growth and forestalling mortality by salvage and thinning so that as much gross growth as possible can be realized," he said.

Hagenstein told the Congressmen that calculating allowable harvest on gross growth and practicing intensive forestry—thinning, fertilization, reforestation with genetically-improved trees and salvage—could increase timber production from ten national forests in Western Washington and Western Oregon by nearly 1 1/2 billion board feet annually. Translating this into social and economic values, he said it would provide 14,400 more basic forest industry jobs and 28,800 more supporting jobs and pump another \$900 million annually into the economy. It would also provide \$19 million more each year to counties for schools and roads.

Hagenstein urged the House Committee to act quickly. "This Congress," he said, "has a greater opportunity than any other in nearly 200 years of our Nation's history to take a bold step forward now by making the people of the United States realize that their own national forests are the largest, strongest and most capable body of forest lands in the country to show how forestry can be practiced."

Two Walled Lake Lumbermen Make Knots in Auto Race

On Sunday November 4 a 1903 Ford owned by the Beatty Brothers of Beatty Lumber Co. in Walled Lake, Michigan completed the London to Brighton run. This is the most famous automobile rally in the world. There were 270 cars competing from all over the world. It took 6 hrs. 15 minutes for Beatty's Ford.

There were eight entrees from the United States. The 1903 Ford acquired in March by the Beattys from Harrah's Automobile collection was completely restored this summer from the ground up. It won a first prize at Greenfield Village in the old car festival in Sept. and left for London on a ship October 5th. It didn't arrive in London until 7:00 P.M. Friday night about 34 hours before the start of the Brighton run.

Larry Markey Jr. of Markey Brothers Lumber Co. Walled Lake, Michigan and his wife Suzanne rode with Edgar Beatty who was the driver. Larry helped in the restoration and acted as mechanic on the run.

David Beatty (Hoo-Hoo No. 65742) of Beatty Lumber cranked up the car to start it in Hyde Park.

Other lumbermen who came to London for the traditional rally were Mr. & Mrs. Chris Snavely of Germain Lumber, Mr. & Mrs. Charles Cluss of Cluss Lumber both located near Pittsburgh and Chris Kindred of Beatty Lumber.

Over 6 million people observed the race along the roadsides between London and Brighton. This 1903 Ford was the only Ford in the run. Most of the cars were built in Europe. A car must have been built before January 1, 1905 to be eligible. The run commemorates the emancipation of the automobile from the days when a man had to proceed any automobile on foot waving a red flag. It has been run every year since 1920 with the exception of the war years.

INDUSTRY NEWS

Ed note: The following is an excerpt from the Oregon Pacific Newsletter of December, 1973.

TREES ARE THE WORLD'S ONLY REPLACEABLE BUILDING MATERIAL

We can't grow water, iron ore, oil, manganese, sulphur, bauxite. When we run out of them, and that day will probably come, we'll either have to (1) synthesize replacements, (2) use substitute materials, or (3) do without.

But not with wood. We grow trees. The "rotation cycle"—time it takes from seedling to harvestable tree—has dropped in the west alone from the 100-plus-years of 1900 to 60 years today, and now Georgia-Pacific thinks it has a 40-year cycle at hand.

Trees have to be cut, weeded, thinned, like plants. There's a misconception that "virgin" timber is good. Wrong. Recently G-P felled a 400-year-old tree and a 56-year-old tree. Both had grown 37" in diameter, and the centuries-old "virgin" was 90% rot.

If we were allowed enough "thinning harvests" — cutting away small trees to give the big ones a chance—foresters say we could increase production 30-40%. Better over-all management could give us 50% more timber annually.

We know good management works: 60 years ago southern forests were considered extinct. Today they're completely restored. Between 1953 and 1968 southern timber inventory increased 42%, and 20% in the north.

Today, nationally, we have 34,000 certified tree farms, in 48 states, comprising 75 million acres. We're growing more than 100 million nursery trees a year for reforestation, in just our Douglas Fir region. And nature grows several hundred million more.

Let's work together!

*Urge Congress to properly fund the Forest Service, so it can increase allowable cut, increase timber sales, and increase reforestation. The Forest Service

almost pays its way as things are. In fiscal 1972 it took in \$350 million from timber sales and had a budget of \$527 million. The investment of a relatively few tax dollars would pay off handsomely.

*Urge Congress to either dramatically reduce or eliminate log exports from all lands—public and private;

*Urge Congress to allow the use of proper and needed weapons to destroy the insects and diseases which are, in turn, destroying our forests;

*Urge Congress to re-forest federal lands as intensively as private forest owners;

*Urge environmentalists to "live and let live", to abide by the multiple-use concept which our industry accepts. We have 11 million acres of wilderness today, but environmentalists want another 5.8 million. If they had their way, in Oregon and Washington alone, we would lose 720 million b.f. of harvestable timber...16% of current Oregon-Washington annual allowable cut.

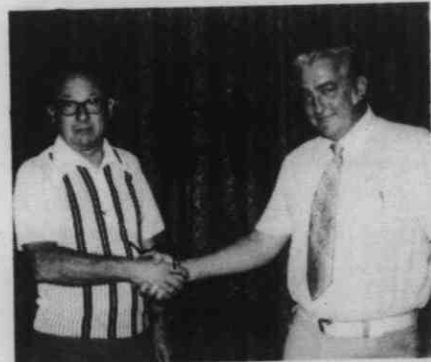

Hoo-Hoo Director Disputes TV Claim

Gentlemen: ~

I am writing to dispute a TV Public Service short shown on your Channel Two regularly. The article is produced by the Dept. of Commerce and the Aluminum Association. This short is very misleading and is intended to make the public believe that aluminum products give great insulation value which will result in a heat savings. This is not the truth.

Aluminum compared to wood has very little insulation value as attested to in the article attached from Readers Digest. Aluminum transfers cold, which causes condensation ruining the interior woodwork, carpeting and finishes.

You can try this test yourself. Check your outside thermometer and then put another thermometer against your aluminum door or window frame on the inside of your home or office. You will find little or no temperature

difference.

As for ecology and environment, if manufacturers were required to pay a price for energy replacement in the manufacture of their products, and also for the pollutant factor in the disposal of products after their end use, aluminum would cost an additional 28%, concrete an additional 24%, steel an additional 9% and lumber only an additional 2%.

Lumber of all our natural resources, is the least producer of waste and harmful effects to pollution and our way of living. As an example, to produce a ton of lumber requires only 430 kilowatt hours of electricity, to produce a ton of steel requires 2700 kilowatt hours of electricity, to produce a ton of aluminum requires 17,000 kilowatt hours of electricity (40 times more the amount of energy than lumber).

As you have demonstrated in the past, your station tries to make the public aware of all the facts. I am sure you will present the facts on both sides as they really are.

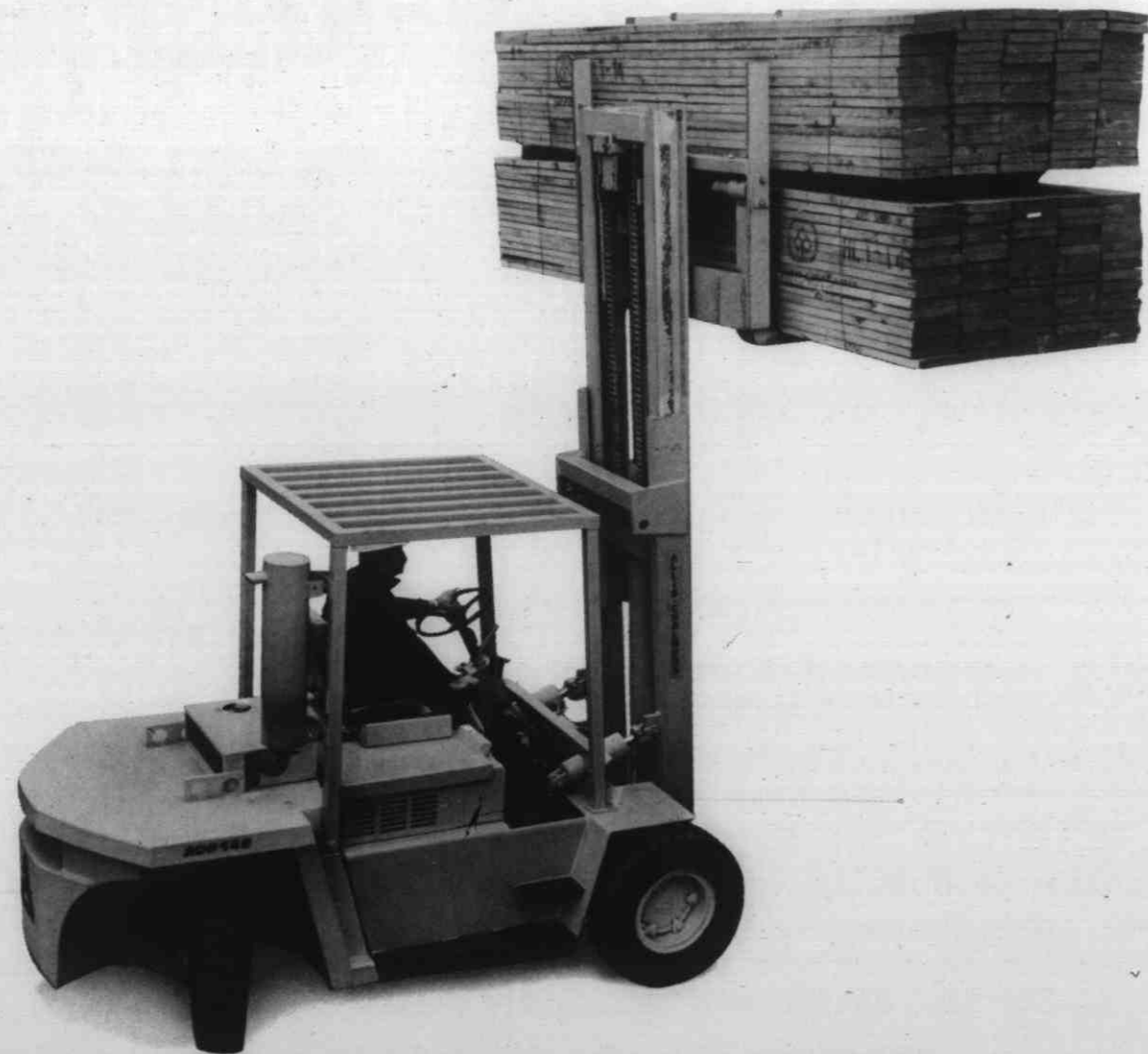

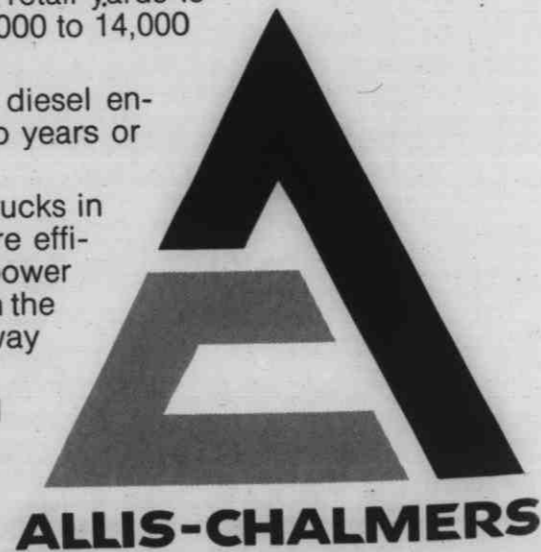
