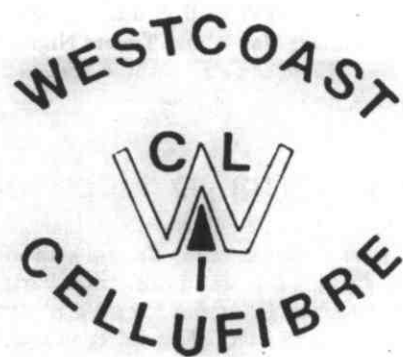

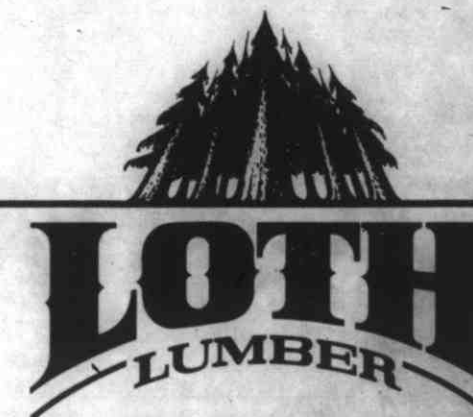

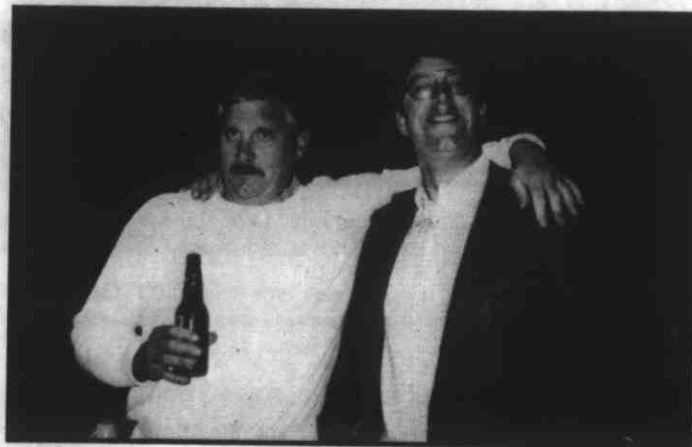

Upcoming events already scheduled are a concat on February 8th; a Men's Draw on March 5th; and the Big Boogie Bash on April 7th.



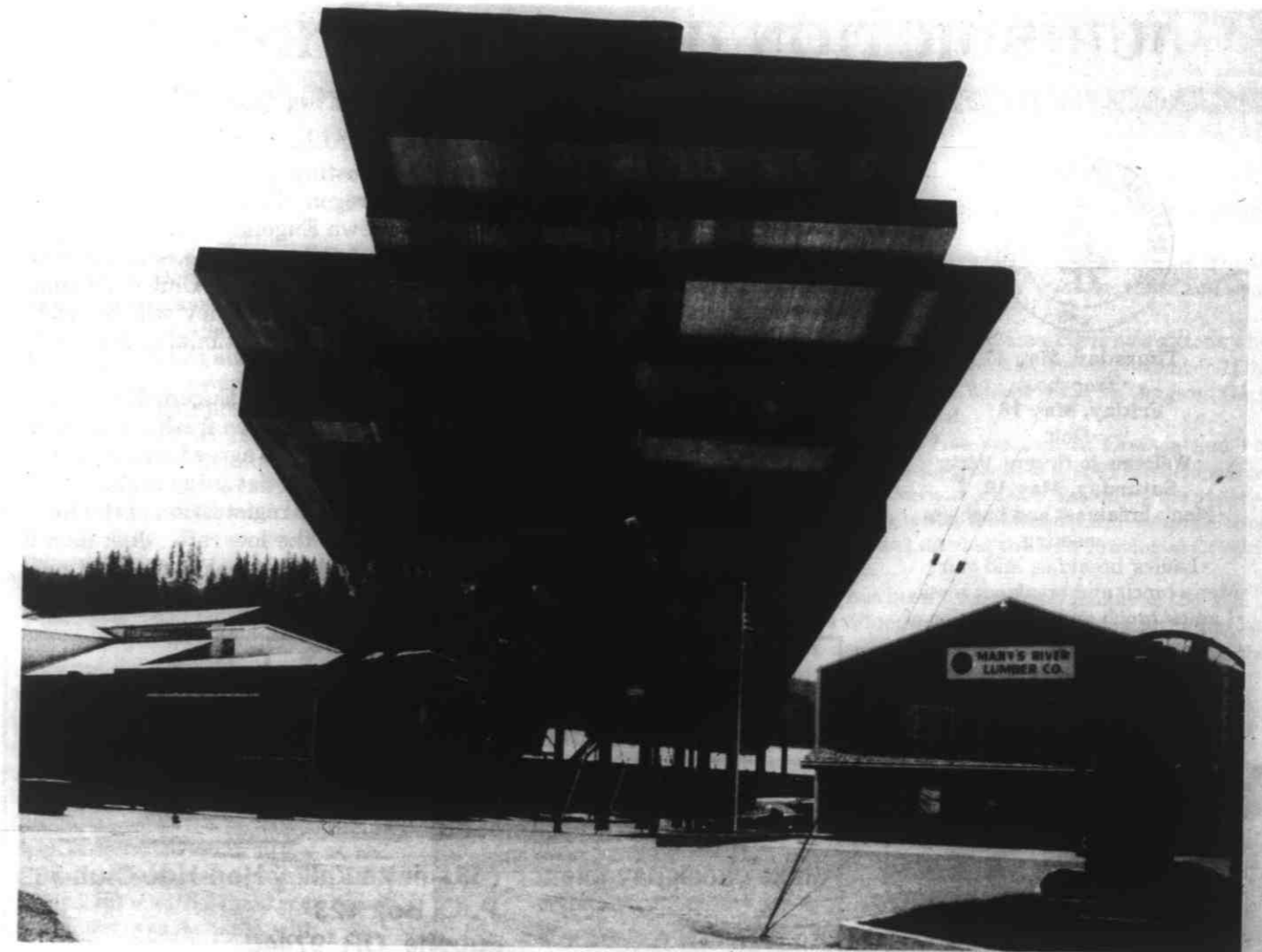

HANCOCK ADDRESSES GRANITE STATE HOO-HOO CLUB #107

At a recent well-attended Granite State Hoo-Hoo dinner, K. David Hancock, Chairman of the National Forest Products Association, addressed the members on behalf of the newly formed American Forest Resources Alliance. He dynamically reported on the industries campaign to emphasize the truth about the industry forest practices and their record of conservation throughout the United States. Led by American's forest product companies, the United States is currently planting over 600 trees annually for every child born in the United States. Millions of trees are planted daily, totalling well over three billion tree seedlings a year.

This planning contributes to the fact that timber fiber is currently being grown at a rate of over 120% a year, as compared to the trees that are harvested and those that die from fire, disease, etc.

The good industry forestry record is being practiced in spite of recent efforts by "preservationist" groups desiring to lock up America's forests and prohibit commercial harvest of timber. The "preservationists" reject the concepts of multiple use forestry on which the American forest products industry and nation were founded.

Hancock emphasized that he saw the "preservationist" attack as an attack not only on the forest and industry but as a very specific attack on the American way of life.

To provide wood products for our children and our children's children to enjoy, the future trend must put more of our forest under good forest practice and good multiple use management. Simply locking them up to please the "preservationist" leadership will not suffice.

The American Forest Resource Alliance is made up of foresters, forest industry companies, National Association of Home Builders, National Retail Lumber and Building Material Dealers Association, North America Wholesale Lumber and Building Material Dealers Association, regional affiliates of all of the above, and many individuals who are simply interested and united in promotion sound forestry for the future of the American economy, as well as the way of life of U.S. citizens.

HOO-HOO AND THE AUSTRALIAN TIMBER INDUSTRY MOURNE THE PASSING OF A PIONEER

Brother Norton Ladkin, born 1915, died December 3, 1989 at Norton Summit, Adelaide, South Australia. He was 74.

Hoo-Hoo is a brother hood of timbermen dedicated to the ideal of a united, progressive forest industry, contributing to the welfare of the community. Norton Ladkin was pursuing this ideal long before he played a leading role in the establishment of the first Hoo-Hoo Club in Australia in 1962 in Adelaide, Club #212.

His passion for everything that the forest industries stood for, from its renewable resource base to the utility of its products, projected an enthusiasm and confidence which knew no bounds. His almost unlimited capacity in terms of forest industry knowledge was undoubtedly based on twenty years of early experience from 1934 in the Sydney timber trade. Here with the timber industry giants of the day and in an era which will never be repeated, Norton, unbeknown

to himself at the time, was in training for a far greater task—and that was the launching of Australia's huge Radiata pine plantation processing industry.

So by 1959 when Norton Ladkin was appointed first chief executive of the Radiata Pine Association of Australia, his experience at the managerial level included merchandising, importing, box and case production, veneer, hardwood and softwood production (imported and plantation grown exotics), pre-cut and pre-fabricated house production and house building.

It is true to say that Norton Ladkin during his next 17 years with the RPAA until his retirement in 1976, eliminated one challenge after another in the marketing of this specie of timber. Some say he took to it "like a duck does to water". During this period, Radiata Pine achieved its present acceptance as Australia's most important commercial specie.

Today Hoo-Hoo in Australia is represented by over 30 clubs with over 1000 members. The success of the movement in the South Pacific area and its geographical isolation from North America led to the establishment of a separate jurisdiction within the International Order of Hoo-Hoo in September 1970. The area became Jurisdiction IV in 1970, with Norton Ladkin elected as its first president.

His contribution to Hoo-Hoo and his standing as a member of the Australian Forest Industry are to be recorded for posterity through a plaque to be placed in Hoo-Hoo International Headquarters, Gurdon, Arkansas. Adelaide Club in 1990 will develop a national project which will be a suitable memorial to this outstanding Australian.

Norton's friends, associates in business and Hoo-Hoo brothers will never forget the warmth of his character and his dedication to the Spirit of Hoo-Hoo.
