We don't know at this time how long the Covid-19 will threaten large gatherings and require social distancing. It will be rescheduled as the 130th convention in 2022. However, we still plan to gather in Hot Springs, AR September of 2021. It's times like these that make you think of the true value of life and of family, of Health, Happiness, and Long Life. As I write this, I am supposed to be at my son's wedding in Houston, visiting with friends and family. Instead, the wedding is cancelled and rescheduled for July. Most major cities have closed restaurants, bars, and event venues. The roads are empty, and the dollar cannot buy what is not even available in stores.

I call upon each of you to cherish those who are dear to you. Reach out by phone, email, note, or card to your loved ones and friends. Connect and support them with messages of assurance and encouragement through these unprecedented times. Let them know you are thinking about them. Stay in and stay healthy.



I was fortunate enough to spend some quality one on one time with Sandy at the Mid-year board meeting recently, and will treasure my last moments spent with her dearly.

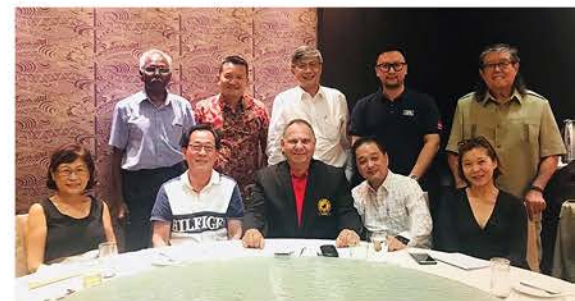

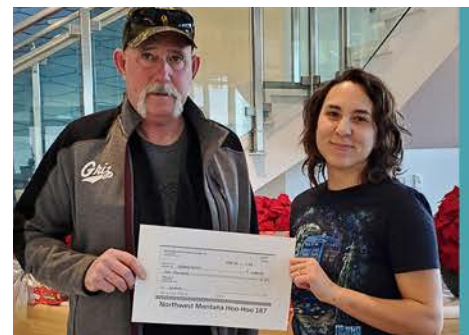

J4 - SYDNEY Hoo-Hoo Club #215

Australia has been undergoing droughts, fires, floods and the loss of wildlife which has been estimated at 1.25 billion and 12.35 million acres of forest. But there's been another event that has not been reported as such: the saving of the world's only rare dinosaur trees.

Close to Sydney, specialist firefighters saved the world's last remaining wild stand of prehistoric trees. From helicopters they struggled to reach a cluster of 200 Wollemi Pines in a remote gorge in the Blue Mountains a week before a massive wildfire bore down. The firefighters set up an irrigation system to keep the so-called dinosaur trees moist and pumped water daily as a blaze that had burned out of control for more than two months edged closer. The Wollemi Pine is one of the world's oldest and rarest trees. Thought to be extinct and seen only in fossils. This stand was only discovered in 1994 and its location remains a closely guarded secret to help protect the trees. The fact that this is the only place in the world where they exist in such a small number in the wild and as these pines have outlived the dinosaurs they needed to be saved.

The Wollemi Pine belongs to the 200 million year old Araucariaceae family and the oldest known fossil is 90 million years. It is a conifer with attractive, unusual dark green foliage, bubby bark and sprouts multiple trunks.
