FRONT COVER Hardwood Logs in a Deep Freeze

The scene on our front cover may be accurately described as awe inspiring. We requested some explanation of the procedure and some information on the dimensions of the entire pile of logs - this is only a small segment of the total display which is beautiful in the sunshine. The ownership is Anthony Timberlands of Beirne, Arkansas, which is about six miles from the Gurdon Headquarters. The following was received from Mike McQueen, manager of the mill:

"The ice covered logs are a portion of over 10 million feet of hardwood logs in storage at Anthony Timberlands, sawmill and chipmill, located in Beirne, Arkansas. The highest quality hardwood in this area is recovered from low lying

bottom land along rivers and creeks. Due to the extremely wet logging conditions, most of the hardwood log inventory must be cut and stored at the mill during the usually drier months of June through October.
"The logs are delivered to the mill by truck"

and stacked in numerous log runs over 40' high and over 500' long. In order to protect the quality mixed specie hardwood logs from insect and stain damage, water is constantly sprayed on the logs via a large irrigation system with over 300 hp of water pumps supplying the pressure. At this particular mill the log inventory has been turned yearly, but with constant water coverage logs can be kept in storage for years with no damage. When the temperature dips into the teens and single digits, as it did in much of the south this year, the result of a log water sprinkling system is the winter

beauty shown in the photograph.
"The Anthony Timberlands plant, located just outside of Gurdon, Arkansas, utilizes quality hardwood logs and tree length hardwood pulpwood to produce hardwood, lumber, cants, crossties, chips, and waste fuel."



Sixty-two persons signed the Guest Book but many attended whose names do

Meeting in the Board Room of a Gurdon Bank on the site where stood the old Hall Hotel in which the six Founders met on that significant day in 1892, the Board discussed many things and took actions significant to all of us. Among the more

1. Increased - effective September, 1984 - the annual International Membership dues from \$14.99 to \$16.99. This will also automatically increase reinstatements from \$19.99 to 21.99 and the first payment for new members from \$24.99 to \$26.99 including the first year's dues and the \$10.00 initia-







Zest for Living . . . Courage for Life's Difficulties

Vaughn H. Justus #50593, Rameses 59, died on November 8, 1983, in an Albuquerque hospital. He was 65 years of age, born August 6, 1918, in Dierks, Arkansas. He became a member of the Hoo-Hoo fraternity as a charter member of the Albuquerque Club #69 in concat #258A on August 7, 1948, and remained a member of Club #69 at his death. He and Peggy and family were residents of Albuquerque from 1946.

Rameses Justus was elevated to the supreme Hoo-Hoo International position as Snark of the Universe by the Diamond Jubilee 75th convention in Washington, D.C., in September, 1966. He had been Secretary of Central New Mexico #69 for ten years, served two years as Club President, two years as State Deputy Snark and two terms as Supreme Nine, J VI.

Active in the lumber business for more than thirty-five years he was sales manager for New Mexico Timber Company for thirty years. He also was employed during his long lumbering career by EPS Industries of Wichita, Dierks Lumber Company and others.

His tenure as Snark of the Universe was an eventful and significant period for the fraternity. Jurisdiction V, which hitherto had been composed of Canada, was expanded to encompass also Australia and the rapidly developing South Pacific. Snark Vaughn boasted in his memo that the jurisdiction ws 6,822,800 square miles. Of course the jurisdiction lines were later redrawn.

Another significant event was the death of Seer of the House of Ancients C. D. LeMaster in March 11, 1967. Ben Springer L-34265 was installed to succeed LeMaster — the seventh Seer in the history of Hoo-Hoo. Shortly after Le-Master's death his widow sent a little statement she had found in LeMaster's papers which Vaughn Justus liked so well he reproduced it in his memo as representing the real spirit of Hoo-Hoo: "The soul of Hoo-Hoo is expressed in the smiling faces of its members, in the hearty handclasp, in willingness to serve and in a sympathy that is full and constant."


If any one word describes the life and philosophy of Vaughn Justus that word is optimism. The Lord blessed him with a beautiful temperament — optimistic, hopeful and courageous. The smile that was almost universal in his photographs was not posed, unnatural or temporary. It was natural, outgoing, fired and fed from within a real expression of fraternalism and concern for his fellow humans.

His children wrote in a memorial — "He served the Lord and lived his whole life with gladness... Those around him were unable to resist his infectious laugh. He taught us to be generous in spirit, to be happy, to have faith in ourselves." In a prayer in a meeting of the Hoo-Hoo International Board meeting in Flying Carpet Inn in Chicago in 1969 he prayed for "Zest for Living... Courage for Difficulties."

As he came to the end of his year as Snark of the Universe his parting message was on the nature and philosophy of the Order and the importance of its principles:

"I believe we have had a good year in the Order. But without the hard work of all the members, the success of the year would not have been possible.

"I believe that if every member would strive to live up to our code of ethics . . . a better, stronger lumber industry would result

"I firmly believe that our Founders' visions have been a reality and have become realities through all of the years. If Hoo-Hoo will never forget its foundations and principles it will always be a source of Health, Happiness and Long Life for its members and for our industry. The past year was one of my most rewarding years not only for me but for my family."

He traveled widely in the interest of Hoo-Hoo during his year as Snark, as most Snarks do. Vaughn's interest in Hoo-Hoo and its members did not end there; he remained active in his club and in other Hoo-Hoo projects. Several years ago he visited Gurdon during the opening of the Museum and impressed us all with his optimism and vision of the future of the order.

We publish his picture in the frame as it hangs in Rameses corner of the Museum. The frame itself has a Hoo-Hoo artifacts application. Jim Jones L-72703, R. 72 writes:

"I was shocked when Peggy called me with the news.

Vaughn had been my friend for many years . . . The frame on

The organizations in which he was active say a great deal about his humanitarianism and his zest for living. Albuquerque chapter of Boy Scout of America, United Methodist Church, Asthmatic Children's Hospital, Camping Committee for Handicapped Children, Masonic Lodge, Ballut Abyad Shrine Temple, Albuquerque TIP Club. In many of these he had held offices, served on governing boards and otherwise contributed.

He is survived by his wife, Peggy; a son, Eddie; two daughters, Mary Louise and Laura Justus McClaure; a brother, Virgil and a sister, Cleo Justus.

Mr. Bonnington was a veteran of World War I. He was active in Boy Scout projects and had served as president of Our Lady of Lourdes Dad's club. He had been a member of Orinda Country Club for more than fifty years.





Snark Wilson Participates When Folsom No. 13 Concats





Committee on Reducing The Cost of Printing The Hoo-Hoo Log & Tally

We apologize that space limitations make it prohibitive to print the entire report of this committee which was submitted to the Board of Directors in the January meeting here. But the decisions were so far-reaching that we feel the membership must be informed and we include the following:

"It was recommended that a notice be placed in the Log & Tally that the quality of paper and number of pages in the February issue was due to budget requirements."

After considering eight alternatives the committee decided that at least four of these were of sufficient urgency that they must apply to the February issue:

3. Reduce the number of pages in the Log & Tally. The committee stated that the February issue be limited to forty pages plus cover. (The pullout Club Officer Directory is eight pages and about six pages of advertising was scheduled.)

4. Reduce the number of pictures in the Log & Tally. The number of photographs is limited to 100. No club should receive more than one page of text and pictures combined. That the cover be printed two color rather than four color. The Club Directory to be printed on the same paper as the other pages of the magazine.

5. Reduce the quality of paper in the magazine. The same quality of paper and cover stock as that used in the August 1983 issue was decided upon.

6. Eliminate the four-color cover in favor of two-color. This was decided as a positive.

The committee-Snark of the Universe Richard W. Wilson, Secretary/Treasurer Bernard B. Barber and Joe H. Breeden S 9 J VII - stated that "By following the above procedure, utilizing the same printer, the Log & Tally could be printed within the budget established by the Board of Directors." The report was approved by the Board in session in Gurdon on Saturday, January 14, with abundant criticism of previous procedures.
