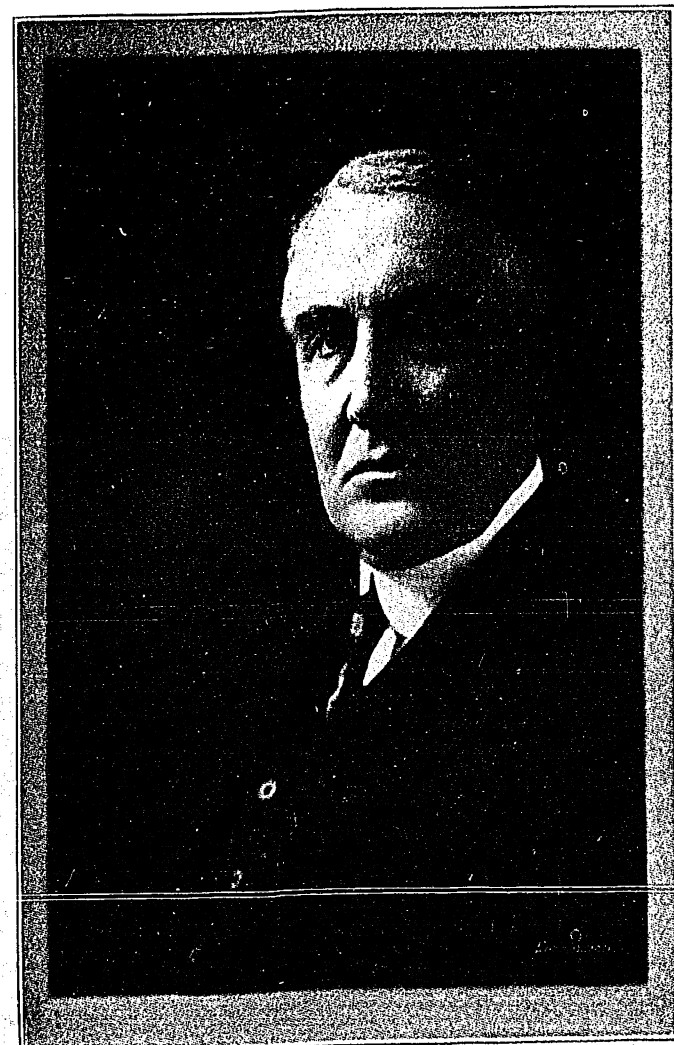

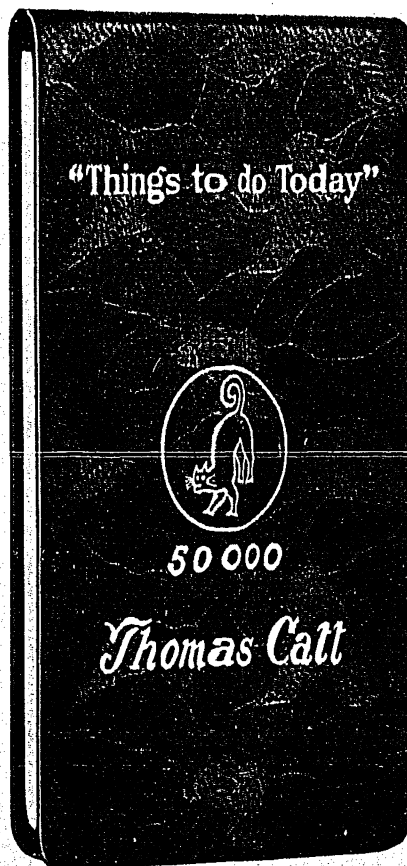

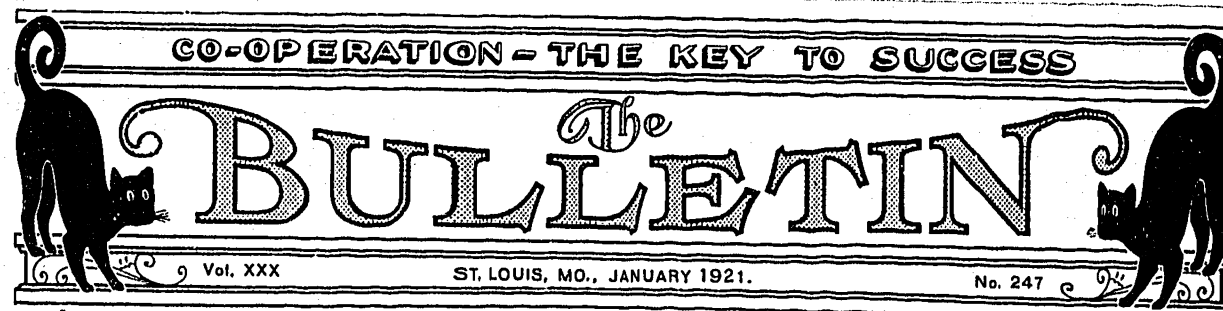

MISUSE OF HOO-HOO EMBLEM

The emblem of Hoo-Hoo is copyrighted, and the regulations of the Order absolutely forbid the use of the emblem for any commercial purpose. Within the last few months frequent requests have been received for permission to make use of the emblem on private letter-heads and for other commercial purposes. Members have called attention, too, to use of the emblem for such purposes without semblance of permission or authority. Such uses MUST STOP.

In a letter addressed to Vicegerents, December 22, 1920, the Secretary-Treasurer stated: "Let it be understood that the emblem of this Order has been copyrighted and that UNDER NO CONDITION will we permit the use of the emblem for private letter-heads or for any purpose or business other than official business of the Order."

There is no single practice that would do more to cheapen the Order and bring it into light repute than lending its insignia to any form of commercial promotion. The thinking member will realize this and will not only have no desire to make use of the emblem, but will aid in preventing abuses of this nature. The Secretary-Treasurer earnestly solicits the support and co-operation of every officer and member of the Order in putting down this abuse of the emblem where it has arisen and preventing further occurrences. This office will ACT PROMPTLY in every case of the kind that is brought to its notice.

CONCATENATIONS REINSTATEMENTS

Among the concatenations held since the last issue of The Bulletin, that at Marion, O., on October 28, takes precedence, both in size and in the attendance of Senator Harding, soon to be inaugurated President of the United States, and of many other prominent members of the Order. Detail of the Concatenation, at which 44 were initiated, appears below.

There was a rousing meeting on January 13 at Denver, the heat that the Mountain States have seen. Thirty-four initiated in due and ancient form and plans were announced for future Concatenations.

Nearly all of the principal conventions of retail lumbermen are featuring Hoo-Hoo Concatenations on their programs. Successful meetings have been held in Indianapolis and Toledo. In Indianapolis the Secretary-Treasurer attended a dinner early in January at which plans were laid for the Concat that occurred on the 19th, at which 11 kittens were led through the gardens and 11 reinstatements were recorded. At Toledo, January 23, there was a crackjack Concat, with 17 initiations. An important Concat early in January was that at Akron, O., on January 5, with 21 new members. Others that have not been set forth in full in this issue, due to lack of space, are meetings held December 4 at Santa Barbara, Cal., with 11 initiations, and at San Francisco December 18, at which 13 candidates were recorded.

A number of meetings are scheduled for early occurrence, a list of these appearing on the last page of this issue.

Among the large number of new members initiated and old members reinstated in the last few months appear the names of many of the leaders of lumberdom, and Hoo-Hoo is rapidly and surely coming into its own.

A stricter inquiry into the qualifications of each candidate for affiliation with Hoo-Hoo and the absolute limitation of its membership to men actually and actively engaged in the lumber industry is having a noticeable effect in causing a majority of those who are eligible to regard this privilege as one too valuable to be neglected.
