
on the Vancouver Island, Cowichan Club 229. In the mean time, hope to see you all very soon.



2020'S IMPACT ON THE LUMBER INDUSTRY

During this past year, between the shutdowns, quarantine, and layoffs, millions of people had lots of down time. In that downtime, people took full advantage of the time and started remodels/building new homes that wouldn't have happened as quickly if it weren't for the extra time. I know for people here in Arkansas, there were multiple homes in Gurdon and surrounding areas that were newly built during the 2020 year. Most of all the logging crews in the South never missed a day due to COVID. They were able to keep the local mill, Georgia Pacific pretty well fed with lumber. Although they kept the mill full of wood, Georgia Pacific services a wide area of the United States. The supply and demand was a little much and has caused a drastic increase of prices and availability issues. There are waiting lists at local depot stores for contractors to get lumber to start construction.

The beginning of 2020, prices for ¾" plywood was around \$32 a sheet. By February 2021 prices had jumped to an average of \$83 and increased by an average of \$15 more to \$99 by the end of April!





That's a 250% increase of one sheet of plywood. Over the last decade, some mill owners have been uncertain on how long they would be able to run production due to pricing being low. Fast forward to 2021, they are being "rewarded" for keeping on keeping on! The demand for lumber is alive and doing very well. Hats off to all who conquered through tough times!




We elected the same slate as last year. Our club wants to wish Beth Thomas a very happy retirement. She truly deserves it.

The Collaborative team of Kane/Nicholson's had to convince the Government that, by converting the design to a sustainable timber-framed construction, would not incur any cost penalties or construction time disadvantages. They also had to convince the regulatory bodies that a timber-framed construction would meet all the fire, sound transmission and maintain a safe construction entity.

Completed Building

After exhaustive reports and investigation, it was found to be quite competitive and complied with all the controls and restriction placed upon the design. It was noted that, had the building been designed as a "timber-framed" construction from the very start, it may have resulted in some additional savings.

It was a remarkable presentation and shows just how well-equipped we are to produce cost-effective and truly sustainable buildings by using the full range of Engineered timber products available and continue to grow in range as time proceeds.
