

EDITORIAL



HHI CHAIRMAN



Things are somewhat returning to normal. Wholesaler OSR's are actually OSR's. At this time No Masks at the airport or airplane. Supply issues in our industry still linger. Prices of 2x4's, sheet goods, and millwork are unrealistic. Freight: Container, Truckload, LTL, Hot Shots are rising out of sight. Freight has also become Unreliable, delivery dates, etc.

New construction homes in S.E. Michigan is starting at \$250.00 per square foot before options. Used homes in S.E. Michigan ranges from \$210.00 per square foot Plus. Nine Hundred square foot 60 year old homes are selling for \$180,000.00! This will pass.

Our 1st house July 76, 900 sq ft ranch \$26,500.00 mortgage 8-3/4%. Sold it a year later for \$42,000.00 bought a 1200 square ft ranch for \$58,000.00 still 8-3/4" mortgage. 1985 bought a 4 year old 2600 sq ft colonial, owner had invested \$150,000.00 on this house we bought January 1985 for \$100,000.00! But our mortgage rate was 14-1/8% fixed 30 year. Who would've thought that 40 years later I got a HUGE Mortgage 30 year fixed 3.2% Sept. 2016.

CDC and WHO sending out confusing conflicting information for over 24 months. Use Common Sense and be Safe.





balls, golf shirt or drink cooler.


Thank you to all the Golf Hole Sponsors – they paid for all the prizes. It was great to catch up with many people we have not seen since our last event a while ago.


Publicity Report – Trap Shoot 2022 Hi from Northern California!



Again, hello from the wet west coast of Canada. I think the last few reports I have submitted have talked about rain. Hmm, it should slow down for the summer, but at


this rate I don't see a campfire ban happening on the coast this year.
