TIP FOR THE MONTH - Cream of Tartar

(Actually an acidic powder by product from wine making – used in baking but used for:

- Collar stains – dampen & rub powder in before laundry
- Pre-treat Whites – teaspoon to 1 litre water & soak before laundry
- Meringue - ½ teaspoon to 2 egg whites
- Tough Stains – rub with paste of hydrogen peroxide & cream of tartar allow dry & rinse
